

Total Population and Population Change in Texas, 1950-2014






Components of Population Change by Percent in Texas, 1950-2010







Total Estimated Population by County, Texas, 2015






Estimated Population Change, Texas Counties, 2010 to 2015

99 counties lost population over the five year period.






Estimated Percent Change of the Total Population by County, Texas, 2010 to 2015

Top Counties for Numeric Growth in Texas (U.S. Rank) by Components of Change, 2013-2014










Percent Population by Race and Ethnicity, Texas, 2000 and 2010






Percent of the Population by Race and Ethnicity, San Antonio and Texas, 2010






Texas White (non-Hispanic) and Hispanic Populations by Age, 2010





Bexar County White (non-Hispanic) and Hispanic Populations by Age, 2013












Percent of population that is Hispanic, Census Tracts, San Antonio, Texas, 2009-2013






Percent of population speaking a language other than English at home and speak English less than very well, Census Tracts, San Antonio, Texas, 2009-2013




Percent of Students Participating in Bilingual or ESL Programs for School Districts in Bexar County, 2014-2015





Percent of population earning \$75,000 per year or more, Census Tracts, San Antonio, Texas, 2009-2013







Percent of population living below poverty, Census Tracts, San Antonio, Texas, 2009-2013







Percent of Housing Units Build Before 1960, Census Tracts, San Antonio, Texas, 2009-2013






Percent of Housing Units Build After 1999, Census Tracts, San Antonio, Texas, 2009-2013







Projected Population Growth in Bexar County, Texas, 2010-2050






Projected and Estimated Population in Bexar County, Texas, 2010-2015






Projected Racial and Ethnic Percent, Bexar County, Texas, 2010-2050






Projected population of 15-29 year old persons by race/ethnicity, Bexar County, Texas 2010-2015






Educational Attainment of Persons Aged 25 Years and Older, NH White, Texas, Bexar County, San Antonio, 2014






Educational Attainment of Persons Aged 25 Years and Older, Hispanic for Texas, Bexar County, and San Antonio, 2014






Percent of Persons by Age Group with at a Bachelors Degree or Higher, Texas, Bexar County, and San Antonio, 2014








Percent of children immunized by ZIP code, Bexar County, TX, 2014
